This proposal outlines a comprehensive plan to construct and renovate Smart Anganwadi Centres (AWCs) in Karkhadi Sector, Padra Taluka, Vadodara District, under a CSR initiative.

The project will address critical infrastructural gaps, integrate **digital learning tools**, introduce **play-based learning modules**, and strengthen **health and nutrition services** for children, mothers, and adolescent girls.

A unique feature will be **child experiential murals**—visually engaging walls designed to transform spaces into vibrant, educational environments.

4. Project Background

Gujarat has made significant strides in industrial growth and governance, but **equity in early childhood care** in rural and interior regions remains a concern.

Many Anganwadi Centres were built **20+ years ago**, and face challenges such as:

- **Dilapidated infrastructure** with safety risks
- Inadequate space, ventilation, and sanitation facilities
- Lack of digital teaching and health-monitoring tools
- Irregular nutrition services

Smart Anganwadis aim to **bridge these gaps** by:

- Providing modern, safe, and inclusive infrastructure
- Integrating technology-enabled learning tools
- Strengthening nutrition and health monitoring services
- Aligning with NEP 2020 & NEP 2025, emphasizing ECCE (Early Childhood Care & Education)
- Introducing the Jadui Pitara toolkit for play-based learning

This initiative ensures every child has the **right start in life**, paving the way for **holistic development and lifelong learning**.

5. Existing Challenges

1. Dilapidated Infrastructure

- o Safety risks deter parents from sending children.
- o Lack of clean drinking water, sanitation, and proper ventilation.

2. Resource Deficiency

- o Limited educational materials.
- o Inconsistent nutrition & health check-ups.

3. Technological Gap

- o No digital learning/monitoring tools.
- o Limited internet connectivity, restricting access to resources.

6. Scope of Work

The project is designed to ensure that each AWC evolves into a **child-centric**, **safe**, **inclusive**, **and technology-driven learning space**, addressing infrastructure, education, safety, health, and community engagement. The scope is divided into key thematic areas and implementation phases.



6.1. Infrastructure Development

- **Building Renovation:** Repair of structural damages, wall deterioration, and roof cracks.
- **Waterproofing:** Terrace and gutter waterproofing using brick bat coba and chemical treatment.
- **Flooring Upgrade:** Child-friendly, anti-skid flooring for improved hygiene and safety.
- **Kitchen Upgrade:** Granite kitchen platforms for safe and hygienic food preparation.
- Sanitation Facilities: Repair and refurbishment of toilets and washrooms.
- **General Repairs:** Filling cracks, strengthening walls, minor masonry, and carpentry works.

6.2. Learning Environment

- **Smart TV Installation:** 32–42-inch screens pre-loaded with curriculum-based digital content (stories, rhymes, interactive modules in local language).
- **Digital Content Delivery:** Pen drive-based offline solutions to overcome connectivity challenges in rural areas.
- **Teaching-Learning Materials (TLM):** Age-appropriate toys, puzzles, flashcards, books, and activity kits to stimulate early childhood learning.
- **Educational Murals:** Vibrant wall paintings of alphabets, numbers, local animals, and hygiene messages to make learning visual, interactive, and joyful.
- **Play-Based Learning Kits:** Integration of the *Jadui Pitara* toolkit as recommended under NEP 2025.

6.3. Child Safety and Comfort

- **Furniture:** Child-friendly seating, tables, storage shelves for TLM, and cupboards for food supplies.
- **Ventilation & Comfort:** Ceiling fans and adequate airflow for healthy classroom environments.
- **Safe Drinking Water:** 1,000-litre Sintex water tanks with plumbing for reliable water supply.
- Safety Installations: Secure gates, railings, fire safety equipment, and child-safe switchboards.

6.4. Community Awareness & Engagement

- **Health Awareness Murals:** Covering nutrition, breastfeeding, hygiene, and immunization.
- Adolescent Girl Empowerment: Educational modules on menstrual hygiene, nutrition, and vocational aspirations.
- **Branding & Identity:** Black granite nameplates with golden lettering for recognition and community pride.
- **Awareness Sessions:** Regular interactions with parents and local leaders to strengthen community participation.



6.5. Electrical & Miscellaneous Works

- **Electrical Installations:** Concealed wiring, LED lights, safe switches, and improved illumination.
- **Signage:** Display of safety guidelines, educational messages, and reminders for discipline.

7. Objectives

- Provide stimulating and interactive learning environments.
- Ensure hygienic, safe, and inclusive spaces.
- Strengthen nutrition & health monitoring programs.
- Foster community engagement and women's empowerment.
- Serve as a Model Smart Anganwadi replicable across Gujarat.

8. Expected Outcomes

- Improved early childhood development (cognitive, emotional, and social growth).
- **Better school readiness** for children aged 3–6.
- Enhanced maternal and adolescent health outcomes.
- Active community ownership & participation.
- Women's empowerment through improved awareness & health access.

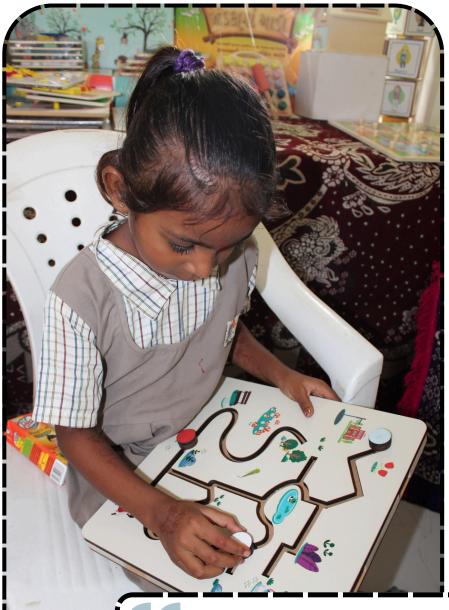
